

COURSE NO: 3280(B) LOWLAND LEADER ASSESSMENT 26 – 27 OCTOBER 2015



The assessment takes place over two days and follows the Lowland Leader syllabus. This is mainly a practical assessment with some theory sessions in the evening. Candidates are advised to prepare fully and refer to the 'Lowland Leader Handbook'. It is important that candidates are aware of the award requirements. A formal review and individual results are given on the final afternoon.

Optional: After successful completion of assessment for the Lowland Leader Award a candidate can choose to attend a two day Expedition Skills Module which is delivered as a combined training and assessment course. The module covers leading overnight expeditions, remote supervision and teaching navigation. For more information contact Mountain Training. **NB This optional element is necessary to qualify to become a D of E Supervisor**.

Pre-requisites

Mountain Training strictly requires that all candidates are registered prior to commencing the course (registration for the Hill and Moorland Leader Award formerly the Walking Group Leader Award and the Mountain Leader Award are not appropriate). The Board will not recognise completion of the course by non-registered participants. Copies of the guidance notes are available from Mountain Training.

The logbook should clearly detail your past walking experience. It is an integral part of the assessment and should be fully completed including:

- Record of Hill and Moorland Leader Award formerly the WGL or ML training course or evidence of exemption.
- Logbook pages showing experience since training, with at least 20 days walking in the appropriate terrain (see syllabus).
- Personal profile page completed by a referee.
- Check that your first aid certificate is current and acceptable to Mountain Training.

You will be required to complete a 'Home Theory Paper' and return it to the Centre prior to the course. This will be sent to you one month before the course.

Candidates should be aware of and prepared for this. The programme may be revised at short notice to take account of weather and other considerations. A detailed programme will be sent to you one month before the course.

- Assessment candidates are expected to provide all their own equipment. You should bring all normal clothing and footwear suited to operating in Lowland Leader terrain. You will be asked to demonstrate what you need to carry as a Lowland Group Leader
- Completed Log Book
- First Aid Certificate


